 - i) Sunday school:

LEAP purchased and installed new refrigerator in Educational Building Kitchen...Thank you!!! All floors waxed in Educational Building, Fellowship Hall and Church Kitchen. Outside church steps painted yellow! Thanks Joyce Manke!
- iv) A/V: All equipment ordered. Tentative install end of September.
- v) Capital Projects: AC/Heat pump Mini-Split System for Pastor, Diane, Stephanie, and Lounge- \$16,500-\$17k (Includes paint for Diane and Pastor's Office, removal and bricking up old ac units.) Replace AC in Church-\$6,425 + permit

f) Social Ministry – Regina Karch

- i) The focus of social ministry in September is, "God's Work, Our Hands." Since we are unable to do "God's Work" as a church community because of Covid, I suggested ways we can do God's Work within our individual family units in the social ministry section of the Redeemer Reminder. There is a special challenge that the CFA is presenting to feed New Jersey's students to be included in Friday's email blast. It is called the 10K Snack Pack Challenge-Honoring 9/11. Sadly, New Jersey is 5th in the nation in terms of childhood hunger during the pandemic. CFA's goal is to raise \$50,000 so they can make and distribute 10,000 snack packs to children in need. Donations and actions are ways that we can do God's Work. Have a wonderful holiday weekend.
- g) Stewardship Judith Schaefer Pastor L and Judith are attending an ongoing webinar on stewardship. This program incorporates our own fall campaign, so that will be a bit later than usual (probably Oct/Nov).

h) Worship and Music – Gerhart Lempp

- i) Our virtual church services have been continued during the last two months with only occasional cliches in transmission. Unfortunately, the Facebook transmission for viewers who stayed home was interrupted after some time due to technical difficulties. The in-person participants were very pleased to have a chance to engage with other members of the congregation at his service.
