We collected \$25.00 gift cards for the following charities: Christmas Blessings Project/ Catholic Charities of Paterson received 41 gift cards, St. Stephen's Grace Church received 22 gift cards, 13 gift cards to Ramsey Responds and 11 to Emmanuel Cancer Foundation. That is 87 gift cards in total which is \$2175.00!

i) Stewardship 2021 –Building a Culture of Generosity I'd like to take a moment to thank all of you who have participated in our current campaign. This has been a difficult year with many different life pathways. We have communicated with social media as our new path to work, visit, learn, and attend church service. We all want to be able to visit with one another and I pray we will all continue to adapt to the "New Normal" as we live with the introduction of COVID vaccine and continue our Health Safety measures.

Our numbers have varied during the 2021 campaign, we have lost a few through moves, a few experiencing difficult times, and, sadly, some have passed on. The Church Council challenge was to have 10 new family units to receive \$1900, we tried diligently but we are thankful to have 9 new family units. We have 80 members who have pledged to our 2021 campaign, about 40% have increased their pledge.

ii) In October 2020, Stewardship challenged Council members to support Membership Challenge of 10 new family units. Each council member signed their personal intent. We got so close when we signed our 9th before12/31/20. I plan to send my donation in as Envelope Revenue by end of January, I know others on council will join me.

h) Worship and Music – Gerhart Lempp

- i) Since the last council meeting all indoor services were performed with a maximum of 10 people per state government requirements for indoor assemblies. All services were virtually streamed for all other members and friends of the congregation. During this last five weeks we had the highest accumulation of services in the church year:

This extraordinary accumulation of events resulted in extreme engagement of Pastor, Stefanie, Fran and Diane and we are very grateful for their service during a difficult time with many obstacles.
