

 - Worship Services this past month continued with reduced participation in church and remote streaming participation by Zoom or Facetime. Participation of volunteers seems to work quite well.
 - ii) Proposal for moving of piano and baptismal font to a newly generated space in the front of the pews on the street side of the sanctuary as shown on the separate sketch.



- (1) Pastor and Fran proposed these changes which were extensively discussed with and supported by all members of the Worship and Music Committee:
- (2) The relocation of the baptismal font to the front of the sanctuary will direct the attention of the whole congregation to the baptism proceeding without having to turn around to follow it. The ceremony presently performed in two stages in front and back will take place w/o interruption. Any children sermon or instruction frequently given by pastor can also be followed easier by the whole congregation.
- (3) When the piano is being used in the present location in the altar area and has to be turned to provide better sound projection and to assure proper communication with other musician(s) the area is extremely congested. Particularly during the pandemic this is not desirable. The new location of the piano will provide ample space for optimum sound projection and placement of other musicians. When not in use it can be moved to the side to not obstruct the view.

- (4) To generate this new space for the baptismal font and the piano, two pews at the front street side have to be removed. The removed pews can be relocated to where the piano and the font have been removed.
- (5) For the reasons stated this change will provide significant advantages. If it turns out at a later time that it is not as expected, changes can be reversed, or further modifications made without too large an effort.
